11. Improving the quality of the college canteen for providing wholesome and nutritious food and beverages to students.
12. Development of infrastructure and improving facilities in the college.
13. Conducting induction, remedial, bridge courses and Add – on courses for the development of the students

14. Providing additional library facilities for meritorious students to further improve their performance and get ranks
15. Continue to train B.Com final students with the collaboration of Vidya Poshak and others (NGO.)

OUTCOME/ACHIEVEMENTS BY THE END OF THE YEAR 2012-13

1. Academic activities were planned and conducted as per the semester scheme designed by Karnatak University. College has an excellent pass percentage; the number of first classes and distinctions are always more than the number of second and pass classes.
2. Other New Activities like Prathibha Shodha - Elocution competition to identify new talents and nurture them.
3. Review of rules and regulations: The college has Students Welfare Executive Committee (SWEC) and a separate Discipline Committee. They meet regularly to maintain discipline in the campus. Student representatives are taken into confidence in maintaining and reviewing disciplinary matters in the campus.
4. Regular conduct of class and subject wise seminars. All teachers engage their classes regularly as per the time-table. In addition, every subject teacher organizes class room seminars. Students are encouraged to present seminar papers in the classroom.
5. Use of modern devices: The college has installed LCD projectors in three class rooms, one of which is a Audio-Visual Hall. In addition, the college has a modern air-conditioned computer lab with broadband internet facility. Students and teachers make use of these facilities.

7. Appointment of faculty (New) to the college :Teaching faculty of the college is further strengthened by appointment of qualified and competent staff for the following departments.

8. Impact of new set of programmes (Extra curricular Depts): Arts Circle, Debating Union, Planning Forum, Sports Department and Ladies Association have organized various programmes to identify and nurture the talent of students and groom their personality. They have conducted various competitions and organized guest lectures, programmes etc to enhance the skills of students.
9. Health check-up of students: Dr Sanjeev Koni have conducted health- check up of the students and given necessary tips to maintain good health.
10. Counselling workshop to students:
 - Brahma Kumari of Ishwariya Vishwavidyala conducted a lecture/ Workshop on how to improve memory power, personality development & how to lead stress free life.
 - Senior teachers of the college counsel students as to how to prepare for examinations in order to get better results.
 - Senior teachers are counselling students regarding behaviour attendance academic performance etc.
11. Maintenance of campus: There is a separate Campus Maintenance Committee which ensures that the campus is clean and beautiful. N.C.C , and N.S.S Units co-operate in maintaining clean campus. Staff members advice and monitor the students to maintain clean environment in the college.
12. Facilities of canteen:-College has a separate canteen with water purifier. A separate caterer is given contract to supply nutritious and

congenial refreshments to students and staff.

13. Development of Infrastructure

- e) Installation of computers and Internet connection to Departmental cubicles

14. Induction/Remedial/ Bridge Course/ Add on course:

Induction and a Bridge course was conducted for the benefit of students of B.Com I Year. It was designed to give knowledge of B.Com degree, Job opportunities available after B.Com and how to prepare for that.

15. Additional Library facilities:-

- a) Students are offered regular library facilities to avail text books through borrower's ticket and identity card.
- b) Facilities of TBL (Text Book Library) are given to economically backward and meritorious students. A set of complete text books is given to these selected students.
- c) Students who excel in studies are given additional text book facility.
- d) Books on general knowledge and other competitive subjects are made available to students who take part in quiz and debate competitions.

e) Internet facility is installed in the library and made available to students and staff to update their knowledge.

f) Library services are made available to teachers and students who are doing M.Phil. and Ph.D and MRP Reference books are provided to these research scholars through college library.

16. Self financing courses- Tally coaching classes are regularly conducted.

Computer Applications in Business being unaided course- concessional fee is charged. Students are provided theoretical and practical education in computer science.

17. Formation of S.W.E.C :

Students Welfare Executive Committee for 2012-13 was formed in August. Students who have excelled in academic and extra curricular activities are assigned the charge of various departments. SWEC has organized various activities under their departments..

18. Network of Students – Parents – Alumni

Regular meetings with parents, alumni and management are organized to review the progress made by the students. Activities to be conducted, programmes to be organized and the achievements to be made during the year are discussed in these meetings.

19. Linkage with Academic and other Professional Bodies: Linkages are established with, SICR of Chartered Accountants and Chamber of Commerce. Guest lectures, seminars etc are organized for the benefit of students. These programmes throw light on various opportunities in professional education.

Free computer training to housewives, and others are conducted by the department of computer science.




